Former artistic director at Karamu House, Terrence Spivey is a member of The HistoryMakers, a 2018 Alan Schneider Directors Award nominee, and 2017 Best Director and 2005 Best Theatre Honcho by Cleveland *Scene*. He was given a proclamation in 2010 by Cleveland Mayor Frank Jackson for his artistic contributions. He garnered multiple awards at Karamu and the institution was given Repertory Company of the Year in 2013 by AUDELCO in NYC. He directed plays such as *Dream on Monkey*

Mountain (2006 Best Production), *The Blacks: A Clown Show* (2008 Best Drama) and *Joe Turner's Come and Gone*. Since leaving Karamu: *Lady Day at Emerson's Bar and Grill* (2018 Chandelier Best Drama-Akron), *Boodycandy* (2016 Top 10-*Plain Dealer*), and the nationally acclaimed *Objectively/Reasonable: A Community Response to the Shooting of Tamir Rice, 11/22/14* at Playwrights Local. Spivey has worked at numerous theatres as director and actor, including Lincoln Center, Cherry Lane Theatre, and Black Girl Ensemble (NYC). He has a B.A. in Theatre from Prairie View A & M University. He served on the board for the Community Partnership for Arts and Culture and is currently a board member for AUDELCO. He is the founding artistic director for Powerful Long Ladder.
