

ACTOR/PLAYWRIGHT



Amy Schwabauer is a Cleveland-based actor and playwright. In 2017, she was named "Best Actress" by Cleveland Scene Magazine for her performance in the premiere production of *This* is NOT About my Dead Dog. Most recently, she presented a staged reading of her new work in progress solo piece The Prettiest Little Burden presented by the River Clyde Pageant in Charlottetown PEI, Canada. This past year she was a member of the Midwives Artist Collective who presented a reading of her play *The* Minotaur Eats Muffins in Chicago. From 2015-2018 she toured The Events of the Warren County Fair As Observed By A Young Astronaut. a toy theater adventure with co-writer and performer Mike Geither. In 2018 she had the pleasure of playing Feste in Twelfth Night. touring to local parks with the Cleveland Shakespeare Festival. Other credits include ten-minute plays for the Manhattan Project Cleveland, a reading of her new work presented by Barnhouse literary series, a

collaboration/performance in *Tingle Tangle* produced by Theater Ninjas, and playing Kilbride in *Snake Oil* directed by Sarah Greywitt. DIRECTOR

Dale Heinen is a director/dramaturg who has directed new plays in Chicago, Glasgow, Cleveland, New York and London, and has workshopped plays in Tokyo and Brazil. Her experience includes seven years as a dramaturg and Artistic Associate at Soho Theatre in London. For seven years, Dale was co-Artistic Director of Footsteps, an equity theatre in Chicago, and was listed three times as one of Chicago's "Best Directors" in *PerformInk*. Dale has directed over thirty professional productions; her work has been recognized by the Jeff Awards and After Dark Awards (both Chicago), and she was the recipient of the Arches Award for Directors (Glasgow). She has a BA from Northwestern University (Evanston, IL) and an MFA in theatre directing from Middlesex University (London).

DRAMATURG

Karin Randoja is an award-winning director, actor, teacher, and singer/composer. For over thirty years, she has directed and dramaturged devised performances, including *This is the Point; Gertrude and Alice; Jacinto;* and *huff.* Karin was a founding member of Primus Theatre and The Independent Aunties, with whom she continues to create original performances. Her work has been seen in Australia, Denmark, England, India, Italy, France, Japan, Mozambique and Scotland. As a teacher/director, she is on faculty at Humber College, and has been a guest instructor at The Centre for Indigenous Theatre and The National Theatre School, of which she is also a graduate.

CREATIVE TEAM

Matthew Gallagher (Original Music) is a nationally active sonic and visual artist who lives and works in Cleveland. He holds a BA from Oberlin College where he studied studio art and music technology. Gallagher works primarily with generative synthesis techniques and mathematical concepts to create dynamic systems that yield uncanny moments of musical synchronicity and beauty with minimal intervention from the composer. His work has been published by SKSK Records, Tusco/Embassy and Imprint Eyes. He looks forward to releases on Hausu Mountain, Moon Villain, and Unifactor. Kristin Jones (Stage Manager/Techical Director) is a Technical Director and Scenic/Lighting Designer who has been working as a theatrical professional in the Cleveland and Columbus areas for the past fifteen years. She has a BA in Theatre from Ohio State University. Kristin currently designs and manages lighting rigs for large, high-profile sports, political, private, and corporate events as well as leads educational technical experiences for high school students pursuing the art. She is thrilled to be involved as Stage Manager and Technical Director for *This Is NOT About My Dead Dog* with the innovative artist Amy Schwabauer.

James Kosmatka (Sound Designer) is a nonprofit administrator and a freelance artist. He worked at Cleveland Public Theatre as Director of Patron Services and as Assistant General Manager, and at Cleveland State University as Assistant to the Dramatic Arts Program Director. Artistic work at CPT includes sound design (Rastus & Hattie, Br'er Cotton, I Call My Brothers), acting (365 Days/365 Plays) and directing (Big Box: Seppuku). Other credits include sound designs for CSU (The Dybbuk, Ubu Roi), the University of Rochester (Emperor of the Moon), and the Beck Center (The Underpants); and directing in Dobama's Marilyn Bianchi Children's Playwrighting Festival. James currently works as an administrator at the American Civil Liberties Union of Ohio.
